Payday Lenders Target Specific Districts in Virginia

A recent report from the Bureau of Financial Institutions shows that **certain areas in**Virginia have become inundated with payday loan shops charging interest rates as high as 390% APR, trapping all customers in a vicious cycle of debt. You have probably noticed this proliferation. An analysis of the Bureau's data reveals that payday lenders target specific areas, and therefore customers — those that are typically more vulnerable to their practices - like military families or urban neighborhood inhabitants. Refer to the following table to see if your district has been targeted and how it stacks up against others in Virginia.

Because there are more than 2 payday lenders for each McDonalds in Virginia and an industry report shows a growth rate of payday lenders at double that of Starbucks, this condition will only worsen. No district is safe, even if there are little or no storefronts currently operating.
